

"Make sure that when you eat and are satisfied, build pleasant houses and settle in, see your herds and flocks flourish and more and more money comes in, watch your standard of living going up and up—make sure you don't become so full of yourself and your things that you forget God, your God." Deuteronomy 8:11-16 The Message

Right before the people of Israel crossed over the Jordan River into "the land flowing with milk and honey," Moses warned the people to "be careful not to forget the Lord your God when you became prosperous," and to "Remember that it was God who gave you the power to be successful." And then he went on to say, "When you have eaten your fill, be sure to praise the Lord for the good land He has given you."

One thing that helps me "not forget the Lord" and remember all the ways God has blessed and provided for me, is looking through pictures on my phone from the previous year. When I did so this year, I was reminded of the home renovation we completed, the family trip we took to the mountains, the fun beach days we had and waves we surfed.

I was also reminded of some difficult moments; like struggling with post-concussion symptoms for three months, then getting covid and having brain fog and stomach issues for another three months on top of that. This was not easy, but the Lord brought us through it.

In the church, remembering is not as easy as just looking through old pictures. Although we do have a few good pictures from the year, the better tool for review is looking at the numbers and remembering personal stories.

In February 2022 Live Oak Church will be 10 years old. If this attendance chart was all we had to go on to gauge our success (fruitfulness), we'd be in trouble. It would be time for us to reconsider our approach to ministry. But as I mentioned above, the numbers don't tell the whole story!

Over the last 10 years we've had different groups of people come through Live Oak Church. College students like Caroline Chambers who attended Live Oak during college and then moved back home when she graduated. Twenty-Somethings like Matt Bell who lived in Wilmington as long as he could then found a better job opportunity somewhere else.

Young couples like Sammy and Sydney Brock who we had the privilege to marry and send off to another town. There have been a handful of people that we've been able to help launch into local and global ministry opportunities, like Sam Marsh and Sydney Sellers.

In 2021 we also saw two of our worship leaders, Morgan and Rose, move out of town. Rose is on staff with YoungLife, and Morgan is working in her field of recreation therapy and soon to be married. And don't forget Ashley Wise, who started attending in college, worked at Live Oak for 7 years, married Gabe and then moved to Japan last year! These are just a few of the people and stories that the numbers represent.

Over the next 10 years, I want to see Live Oak Church continue to grow both spiritually and physically. I want to see the people of Live Oak grow spiritually by becoming more like Jesus. I want to see our church community grow physically, reaching more friends, neighbors and coworkers, who are far from God, and introduce them to Jesus Christ, and help them follow Him in their daily lives.

To see this vision become a reality, each of us will have to participate in the work of evangelism, that is, sharing the story of Jesus with people who are looking for more out of life. Who is one person or family you could invite into your church community this year?

As you can see we were a bit shy of meeting our budget goal for the year by \$13,658. But the good news is that our regular giving was more than our regular expenses, which enabled us to save \$19,342.

You might be thinking, "Wait, how did we save money if we were \$13,658 short of meeting our budget goal?" Great question! Our budget goal includes our generosity fund of \$14,908 and a 10% savings goal of \$33,000. To summarize, we were short of our goal but not of our actual spending. This means at the end of the year we had \$67,862 of operating reserve income. And there is more good news, in three months we raised \$20,875 for the building fund on top of regular giving.

My response to this is to thank God for his provision through your consistent generosity towards Live Oak Church! Your generosity shows that you trust God to provide for all your needs and that you believe in the work of the local church. Thank you.

Looking ahead into the new year, we have two big financial goals for Live Oak Church.

The first goal is to increase our monthly budget from \$31,500 to \$50,000. This will make it possible to hire the staff team we need to establish Live Oak as a healthy and thriving local church in Wilmington NC. The staff team will include Lead Pastor, Community Pastor, Administrative Assistant and Student Leader.

The second goal is to save money to purchase a church building. We believe now is a good time to pursue this goal because buying a building and eventually paying it off is a better use of resources than renting long term. And we believe this is a strategic move to establish Live Oak's roots in our local community. I recently met with a commercial banker to see what we need to do to prepare to purchase a building. The short answer is that we need to have \$120,000 in operating reserve income and save \$200,000 for a down payment over the next two years.

The leaders of Live Oak Church lead from the principles of faith and wisdom. Faith approaches these goals believing that God "is able, through his mighty work within us, to accomplish infinitely more than we might ask or think." Ephesians 3:20 We believe He is able to provide everything that we need through our church body. Wisdom approaches these goals practically, knowing that there is enough money within our church body to increase our monthly budget to \$50,000 and save \$200,000 for a down payment.

Do the math on how much 100 people would have to give to accomplish these financial goals. The real power is when you put faith and wisdom together, when you act on what you believe to be true. If we all did this we would see God do "far more than we could think or ask!"

With that said, "You must each decide in your heart how much to give. And don't give reluctantly or in response to pressure. "For God loves a person who gives cheerfully." - 2 Corinthians 9:7 Prayerfully consider what you are able and willing to give towards these two goals. I believe we are going to see God provide everything we need to do the work He's called us to. Again, thank you for trusting God and trusting us with your generosity!
